The aim is to conduct formative research to better understand risk and protective factors for HIV/STI transmission among MSW in Ho Chi Minh City. In the first phase, we will conduct qualitative interviews with MSW to better understand local terminology, cultural factors, reasons for engaging in sex work, HIV risk dynamics, barriers and facilitators of HIV testing/care, and will describe in more detail beliefs about HIV/STI risk. Second, we will use the information gained through the qualitative interviews to design a larger, culturally responsive, quantitative assessment. <p>This study will lay the groundwork for a randomized controlled trial of a behavioral intervention to improve medication adherence among HIV-infected youth and to determine whether the intervention structure and content can be used across risk groups with varied sexual identities, including lesbian, gay, or bisexual (LGB) versus heterosexually identified. We will adapt the Life-Steps intervention designed by our group for HIV-infected adults to be responsive to the needs of HIV-infected adolescent. Following a 2 month intervention development phase involving qualitative focus groups with 48 adolescents (24 LGB and 24 heterosexual), the intervention will be piloted among 20 HIV-infected youth (10 LBG and 10 heterosexual). Using a pre-post design, the study will explore whether HIV-infected youth who complete the behavioral intervention (Life-Steps) report improved antiretroviral medication adherence.</p>

<p>The objectives are to: (1) develop and implement a combined contingency management (CM) and behavioral activation therapy (BAT) intervention aimed at HIV-infected individuals who are engaged in HIV care at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center (BIDMC) and are currently using crack, cocaine, or methamphetamine; (2) evaluate the acceptability and feasibility of the intervention by assessing barriers to enrollment and retention; (3) evaluate the impact of the combined intervention on reductions in stimulant use and explore the impact of the intervention on high risk sexual and drug using behaviors, HIV plasma viral load, CD4 cell count, and medication adherence. The novel treatment approach incorporates BAT with CM to enhance and prolong the effects of CM alone. HIV-infected individuals will be recruited from BIDMC and will receive both CM and BAT. Follow-up assessments will be performed at the end of the intervention and then 3 months post intervention. <p>This project's goal is to improve medical care processes and patient outcomes in clinical practice settings using routine collection of patient-reported outcomes (PROs) administered by computerized adaptive tests (CATs). The research team will integrate PROMIS data with other data captured during clinical care to deliver clinically useful information to the provider at the point of care in real time. The team will evaluate PROs in a nationally distributed consortium of HIV clinics. This project will leverage extensive resources from the Centers for AIDS Research (CFAR) Network of Integrated Cohort Studies (CNICS); a consortium of 9 clinical research sites providing care for a well-characterized and demographically heterogeneous cohort of >20,000 HIV-infected individuals. CNICS has committed to collection of PRO data. The study's aims include: 1. Develop and assess PROMIS short forms and hybrid CATs for patients with HIV. The team will evaluate five PROMIS I domains in Spanish and English selected by HIV-infected patients, providers, and researchers and will develop and evaluate the two new domains of perceived stigma and positive affect. The team will use high quality mixed qualitative and quantitative methods, modify standard CAT algorithms to ensure that items patients and providers deem important are administered, and analyze PROMIS items for differential item functioning (DIF) and individual- and group-level DIF impact. 2. Determine the effect on care processes and patient outcomes of integrating routine PROMIS CAT PRO data with individually tailored treatment recommendations using a comprehensive health improvement model in nine HIV clinics. The team will engage in quality improvement initiatives to involve stakeholders and overcome barriers to routine PRO collection with PRO and clinical data and tailored recommendations delivered to providers in real time at the point of care. The team will use a randomized controlled trial to determine the intervention's impact on process outcomes, clinical outcomes, and satisfaction with care. 3. Collaborate with the PROMIS Network to add value to the PROMIS initiative. The team will contribute patients, data, and software tools. The team will develop and evaluate techniques to analyze DIF in data collected by CATs.</p>

Narrative Report

Previous Research Experience.

In 2007, I applied for, and was selected through a competitive search process, to be a Post-Doctoral Fellow at Massachusetts General Hospital/Harvard Medical School. After the successful completion of the Fellowship, I was offered my current position at Massachusetts General Hospital/Harvard Medical School, for which I am 100% effort. I have worked for the previous 10 years on several NIH, CDC, MA state, pharmaceutical, and Institute funded projects at either Massachusetts General Hospital/Harvard Medical School or Fenway Community Health. Although I am currently 100% effort at Harvard/MGH, some of my current research projects are subcontracted to Fenway, where access to the patient and community populations I conduct research with is feasible.

Within the past two years, I was awarded a new investigator R03 (NIDA) to develop a behavioral intervention to treat crystal methamphetamine (crystal meth) abuse/dependence and reduce sexual risk taking in men who have sex with men (MSM) who are at risk for HIV acquisition. The treatment incorporates behavioral risk reduction counseling approaches (e.g.

information-motivation-behavioral skills building, IMB) with behavioral activation therapy to treat depression (a moderator in the IMB model), reduce substance use, and help participants re-engage in healthier life activities that do not involve substance use or risky sex. The treatment appears to be an acceptable and feasible intervention for MSM with crystal methamphetamine abuse/dependence who are at risk for HIV infection, and may be a potentially efficacious approach for MSM, worthy of pilot testing in a randomized controlled trial. As such, I recently (May 2010) submitted a NIDA R34 to conduct an RCT pilot of the intervention and this application was submitted through Massachusetts General Hospital.

My research also extends to a current, joint collaboration between the Massachusetts Department of Public Health AIDS Bureau, Justice Resource Institute (JRI), and Multicultural AIDS Coalition (MAC). The purpose of this study is to gain a deeper understanding of social and sexual networks, knowledge of STIs and HIV and perceptions of risk for disease, and barriers and motivators to accessing care from the perspective of African American/Black MSM in the greater Boston area. A similar MDPH funded project for which I am the PI is assessing how sexual environments, such as sex parties, impact sexual risk behaviors among MSM. These projects are collecting information in order to determine the best potential HIV prevention interventions to employ with these at risk subpopulations.

I am also the PI of two Harvard Center for AIDS Research (CFAR) grants – the first is to develop and implement a behavioral intervention to improve medication adherence among HIV-infected adolescents, and the second is to develop and implement a combined contingency management and behavioral activation therapy intervention aimed at HIV-infected individuals who are engaged in HIV care and are currently dependent on crack, cocaine, or methamphetamine.

I am involved with global health research projects at Harvard/Massachusetts General Hospital as well. I direct and am a co-investigator on two NIMH funded (R21s) studies in India: 1) the first is to understand the social and sexual networks of MSM who are married to women in Mumbai (PI: Kenneth H. Mayer); 2) the second is to understand the impact of HIV stigma, discrimination, intimate partner violence and/or history of abuse or trauma on risk behavior and the rates of co-occurring mental illness and drug or alcohol abuse among MSM in Chennai, and then to develop and pilot test a randomized controlled culturally responsive intervention among this at risk population (PI: Steven A. Safren). Such examinations will lead to the end goal of developing a multi-component intervention (randomized controlled efficacy trial) for each site (Mumbai and Chennai) that address co-occurring disorders and other recognized substance abuse syndromes and their impact on increased incidence of HIV infection among MSM. In addition, I am a co-investigator and member of the protocol development team for HPTN 063 – a study to conduct preparatory research needed to design a behavioral intervention to decrease sexual transmission risk behaviors in HIV-infected individuals in care and to determine whether a similar intervention structure can be used across various sexual risk groups and cultural settings. The study sample includes HIV-infected heterosexual men and women and MSM in care settings in Africa (Lusaka, Zambia), Asia (Chiang Mai, Thailand), and South America (Rio, Brazil), who have reported recent (within 3 months) HIV sexual transmission risk behavior (Protocol Chair: Steven A. Safren). Finally, Dr. Mimiaga is the Harvard/MGH site-principal investigator on a Harvard Catalyst grant (PI: Dr. Donn Colby) examining the HIV prevalence and associated risk behaviors of male sex workers in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

Narrative Report of Teaching

I am currently teaching within the MGH Behavior Medicine Seminar Series for Post-Doc Fellows in the Behavioral Medicine and Adult CBT tracks, and am the Instructor for EPI220 (Spring 2009 - recurrent): Psychiatric Diagnosis in Clinic and Community Populations, at Harvard School of Public Health (Department of Epidemiology).

Also, at any given time—over the past 8 years— I supervise a team of 5-8 research associates, project managers, research interns, and/or study coordinators on various research studies related to HIV/AIDS primary and secondary prevention. Additionally, in the Behavioral Medicine Service at Massachusetts General Hospital, I provide consultation and teaching to a number of the psychologists and psychiatrists regarding behavioral and epidemiological statistical analyses, including power and sample size calculations for all junior staff within the Department for their grant application submissions. On an ad-hoc basis, I provide statistical support for the Behavioral Medicine Service team members for papers or other projects when needed.
