PART II: Research, Teaching, and Clinical Contributions

A. Narrative Report

Research. As a clinical health psychologist with a strong research interest in smoking cessation interventions, I have specialized in designing interventions for targeted special community and hospital-based populations (primary care physicians, cancer survivors, pregnant women). I have conducted research in the areas of physician behavior change, patient behavior change (smoking cessation, nutrition and exercise), telephone-delivered interventions, and the role of culture on cancer preventative behaviors and beliefs. My publications reflect these areas of interest. Additionally, I have developed an expertise in developing and analyzing qualitative research. My papers illustrate work in which I have taken the lead on examining a smoking cessation research question and my recent work has focused on answering physician counseling questions. The contributions of my qualitative research and behavioral intervention development background are reflected in these papers and collaborations.

I intend to continue pursuing mixed methods research, combining qualitative and quantitative measures, to conduct cancer prevention research and have just received two grants that will enable me to do so. An American Cancer Society Mentored Research Scholar grant is supporting my research examining risk perceptions of individuals undergoing lung cancer screening. With funding from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's Smoke Free Families Initiative, I am examining the effect of depression and anxiety on postpartum relapse to smoking. Additionally, I have just received funding from the NCI to conduct a pilot behavioral and pharmacological intervention for early stage lung cancer patients.

Teaching. Similar to my research, my teaching is focused in four areas: clinician-patient communication, cross-cultural care, qualitative research, and patient behavior change. I have taught clinician-patient communication at Brown, Harvard, and Albert Einstein medical schools

and am presently teaching a communication course to the primary care residents at MGH. I have taught cross cultural communication to MGH primary care residents and Harvard Cancer Center physicians and conduct sessions on qualitative research design with residents, fellows, and physicians at Harvard Medical School hospitals. In the psychiatry department, I deliver an annual smoking cessation lecture to the addiction fellows and conduct an annual 3-week training session for the psychology interns and fellows on Motivational Interviewing, an addiction counseling strategy. I currently serve as a research supervisor for an MGH behavioral medicine intern and postdoctoral fellow.

Clinical. I am one of the founding members of the MGH behavioral medicine program. I presently see oncology patients and their family members for cognitive behavior treatment and serve as a group clinical supervisor for the MGH behavioral medicine interns and postdoctoral fellows.
