## Clafin Distinguished Scholar Awards for 2003



*Jane Clafin*

In 1993, The Women in Academic Medicine Committee, originally chaired by Mrs. Jane Clafin, was established to facilitate the academic careers of women in science at MGH. Recognizing that a significant obstacle to career advancement was the difficulty of maintaining research productivity during the child-rearing years, this committee, with the sponsorship of ECOR, established the Clafin Distinguished Scholar Awards. The purpose of these awards is to provide bridge funding for junior faculty to overcome this obstacle. It is intended that this transitional funding will increase opportunities for women to advance to senior positions in academic medicine.

Awards are for two years, with a maximum of \$30,000 in direct costs per year.

Mutations in GPR54 in humans and Gpr54 in mice cause hypogonadotropic hypogonadism, pubertal delay, and sexual infantilism that can be corrected by the administration of exogenous gonadotropin-releasing hormone. Our data (combined with that of other research teams in Boston and the United Kingdom) were presented in the *New England Journal of Medicine* in October, 2003. Not only does this article present a new biologic pathway critical for the regulation of reproduction, but it is the first time that the Journal has published animal data.
