

FELLOWSHIP IN CLINICAL INVESTIGATION AT MASSACHUSETTS GENERAL HOSPITAL

We are pleased to announce a unique two-year fellowship in Clinical Investigation sponsored by the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Massachusetts General Hospital beginning July 1, 2006. The purpose of the fellowship is to provide promising young oral and maxillofacial surgeons the opportunity to develop specialized knowledge, experience and skills that will qualify them uniquely for careers as academic oral and maxillofacial surgeons. It is expected that the trainee will ultimately practice Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery in an academic setting, teach and carry out an analytic, clinical research program. The fellowship is funded by the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Foundation.

During the first year of the program, the Fellow will attend the Harvard School of Public Health and obtain a Masters of Public Health degree in an area of his/her choice (see the online catalog at <http://www.hsph.harvard.edu/mph/>). Alternatively, the Fellow may enroll in the Clinical Scholars Program offered at Harvard Medical School and obtain an MS degree (<http://www.hms.harvard.edu/gradprograms/scsp/>). The second year will be devoted to a major research effort with ½ -1 day each week available for clinical activities. The fellow will attend relevant seminars and lectures as part of the Clinical Research Program based at the Massachusetts General Hospital (<http://crnet.mgh.harvard.edu/home/home.asp>), and at the Harvard Schools of Public Health and Dental Medicine.

Eligibility requirements for the fellowship are:

1. Must hold a DDS or DMD from an ADA accredited institution
2. Must have successfully enrolled in or completed an OMFS residency from an ADA accredited institution
3. Must be a member or candidate member of AAOMS or its resident's organization
4. Must commit to serving in a full-time faculty position for a period of 5 (five) years after completing the fellowship.

Salary and Benefits:

1. Salary 45-55K per year (depending on qualifications)
2. Full tuition support for one year graduate degree program
2. Indebtedness relief for educational loans \$12,000 per year during the fellowship provided by the Foundation. An additional \$10,000 per fellowship year will be placed in an escrow account and will be awarded to trainees once they complete five years as full-time members of an OMFS faculty.
