# Name That Force

## Rules and Directions

### You will need:

2 players per team (1 or more teams may play)

Name that Force cue cards

30-second timer/clock

### Objective:

The object of the game is for player #1 to describe a Force of Magnetism in 30 seconds or less to player #2.

### How to Play:

- Player #1 is given a cue card that contains both the answer and multiple clues to a specific Force of Magnetism.
- Player #1 offers the clues (in a rapid-fire manner) to player #2.
- Player #2 offers answers as the clues are given.
- The team is given 30 seconds to identify the correct Force of Magnetism.
- For every correct answer, the team is awarded \$5,000.00.
- Elimination from the game occurs after a team has not having identified the correct Force of Magnetism **twice** in the given time frame.
